School Concert (T4) & Gymnastics (T3)

A note will be coming home soon with both of these events on it. Gymnastics is in T3 and is an important part of the curriculum. We do the gymnastics program every two years to ensure that we are covering the expected curriculum. We will be having "Be Skilled Be Fit" come in to run the program again as they are accredited instructors. As a school we will be subsidizing part of this payment for each student. Instead of the regular \$43.00 we will only be asking each student to pay \$32.50 for the program.



Also in T3 we will be having Dance 2B Fit come in to support classroom teachers with the

preparation of items for the school concert in Wk 2 of T4. This company come in and work with the school on a theme for the concert and then they choreograph items, assist with the running of the concert (music and running of the event) and all students and their classroom teachers will receive a lesson 1x week in T3 to prepare items. A number of schools have started to engage the services of providers for this purpose as it supports the classroom teachers with the ever increasing workload expected of them. The cost would normally be \$40.00 per student (only the first 2 children in a family) however as a school we will be subsiding this also. We will only be asking for \$20.00 per student. For the



concert prep only the first two children in the family pay so this is a great deal for our larger families.

We are sending a combined note out very soon so that families have plenty of time to pay off these fees.

We have contacted the Departments Probity Unit to confirm the following information:

The Department of Education requires an Appendix 5 form to be filled out for <u>EVERY</u> Volunteer (Parent Helper) when helping out at Warragamba Public School.

Appendix 5 form is valid for the length of time that the Volunteer (Parent's) child is enrolled at Warragamba Public School, *providing* that the Volunteer (Parent) is doing volunteer work at the school consistently over that time.

If for any reason the Volunteer (Parent) has not volunteered consistently: Eg. Sports Carnival Term 1 and Christmas Concert Term 4 only, then they must fill out an Appendix 5 Every Year.

If a Volunteer (Parent) has a paid job with a Working With Children check. *Eg.* A Nurse, Teacher, Police Officer, etc... *they still have to fill out an Appendix 5 (100 points of ID & declaration).*

Pedestrian Safety

Children need assistance dealing with the traffic environment until at least the age of 10 as they are not equipped physically or developmentally to make the crucial decisions to keep them safe. Like learning to drive a car, children need practice and experience to walk in the traffic environment.

Alongside the benefits of learning road safety, it is a great chance to spend time with your family and good exercise!! Children are vulnerable road users. Anywhere where there is a potential for moving vehicles is a potentially dangerous traffic situation for children. This includes residential areas, car-parks, at traffic lights, along footpaths, pedestrian and other crossings, driveways, quiet streets, and busy streets.

Although children may think they can handle crossing a road by themselves, remember that children:



- are easily distracted and focus on only one aspect of what is happening
- are smaller and harder for drivers to see
- are less predictable than other pedestrians
- cannot accurately judge the speed and distance of moving vehicles
- cannot accurately predict the direction sounds are coming from
- are unable to cope with sudden changes in traffic conditions
- do not understand abstract ideas such as road safety
- are unable to identify safe places to cross the road
- tend to act inconsistently in and around traffic

Many children below the age of 10 years do not have the capability or judgment to handle many pedestrian situations. Children need to be accompanied and closely supervised by a parent or adult carer to keep them safer. Parents and caregivers have a key role in educating their children about road safety. Children learn about road safety largely by experience. Parents and adult Carers have opportunities in day-to-day routines to discuss road safety with children on the way to the newsagent, local shop or going to school. Whenever crossing roads, it is an idea to talk about when and why it is safe to cross the road with your children so they can gain a good understanding of road safety issues.

You have the ability to check and change any details of the payment before the payment is processed.

Receipts can be emailed and/or printed.

Details of the payments are passed daily to the school where they will be receipted against your child's account. Please supply the receipt number on the permission note required for the event.

Cash and cheque payments will still be accepted.

Busways School Opal Tap Campaign Term 2

Term 2 will see Busways continuing to look to your school for support in our efforts to enforce the use of Opal cards on our buses.

This term will see Busways Inspectors checking to ensure students are using their Opal cards when boarding the school bus. Students that do not present a valid Opal card will be asked to pay a fare. Failure to produce a valid Opal card or bus fare will result in the Inspector recording the student's name.

Below is an example of the form our Inspectors will use.

After the school inspection the names that were recorded will be emailed to the school, with a request for the school to follow-up with the students and parents/guardians concerned.

All students need to produce a •School Opal card •Child/Youth Opal card •Or pay a fare to travel on our buses.

Please explain to the students and parents involved that an Opal card is important because it is used to determine demand for bus services. If students don't have an Opal card to tap on and off the service will appear underutilised and may be considered for cancellation based on low passenger numbers.
